1. PROFILE OF THE COLLEGE

St. Aloysius College, Edathua is a first grade college which has completed fifty one years of glorious service to the cause of higher education. Now, it is a well-established NAAC re-accredited centre of learning offering a variety of undergraduate and postgraduate programmes. The Department of Commerce offers facility for research leading to the award of Ph D.

The college is situated in the Edathua Panchayat of the Kuttanad Taluk in the lake district of Alappuzha. It is the only temple of higher learning of the kind in the entire region of the one time granary of Kerala, Kuttanad. Standing atop the main building of the college, there is a panoramic view of the paddy fields, clothed in the richest green. The luxuriant greenery, meandering rivulets and the placid tranquility altogether provide a congenial atmosphere for learning and development.

St. Aloysius College was founded in 1965 by St. Georges Forane Church, Edathua. It was the realization of the vision and far sightedness of late Very. Rev. Fr. Zacharias Punnappadom (the first Manager) and Dr. P.T. Joseph (the first Principal) under the patronage of Servant of God Mar Mathew Kavukattu. The great visionaries had in their mind the noble task of imparting quality higher education in the backward agrarian region of Kuttanad which lacked any facility for higher education. The college, though run by the catholic minority community, admits students of all castes and creeds with due respect to different faiths and religious denominations.

The College had a very humble beginning. It started functioning in St. Aloysius High School as a junior college affiliated to the University of Kerala with 189 students, 9 teachers and 7 non-teaching staff. In 1966, the college was shifted to the present site. The institution owes an immense debt of gratitude to late Very Rev. Fr. Cyriac Kottayil who in his capacity as the manager was instrumental in erecting the main building of the college. In 1983, following the bifurcation of Kerala University, the college came under the jurisdiction of the newly established Mahatma Gandhi University.

To meet the evergrowing demand for higher education in the region,

the college was upgraded in 1977 by introducing undergraduate programme in Economics. Post graduate programme was introduced in 1984.

The College has now grown into a premier educational institution with 73 teaching staff, 19 non-teaching staff and 1149 students on the rolls. It has now to its credit 9 UG and 5 PG programmes.

2. EMBLEM AND MOTTO



THE LANDSCAPE: The top left segment of the emblem depicts the landscape of Kuttanad where the college is situated. St. Aloysius College is the only centre of higher education in Kuttanad.

THE BOOK: The open Book on the right segment stands for the book of knowledge from which generations of students have imbibed the wealth of knowledge to mould their lives as worthy citizens of the land. The beam of light that falls on the book signifies that true knowledge comes from God.

THE LIGHTED LAMP: The lighted lamp symbolizes the light of wisdom which dispels the darkness of ignorance and illiteracy and illuminates the students' mind with wisdom.

MOTTO: The Sanskrit saying at the foot of the emblem: "Let thy divine light shine miraculously" reminds the students of their role to be beacons of light in the society as they have received enlightenment from this centre of higher learning.

3. MANAGEMENT

The College is owned and managed by St. George Forane Church, Edathua and the present manager is Very Rev. Fr. Mathew Chooravady. The Archbishop of Changanacherry, His Grace Mar Joseph Perumthottam, is the Patron of the College. The college enjoys the privileges of a minority institution based on religion as it is run by the Catholic Church. Minority status certificate was conferred on the college by the National Commission for minority educational institutions, Govt. of India on 22/03/2013.

4. ADMISSION NORMS

The admission to all classes except those in the self-financing stream is governed by the following norms. In each programme:

1. 50 percent of the seats will be filled by open selection on the basis of merit (at present CAP)
2. 10 percent of the seats will be reserved for the catholic students from parishes defined by the management, strictly on the basis of merit.
3. 20 percent of the total seats shall be reserved for students belonging to SC/ST/OEC/OBC in the order of the given preference.
4. The remaining 20 percent seats will be filled by Management quota.
5. A 3 percent of the seats (from category No.1) in all the courses may be reserved for students with disabilities.

The selection of the students under 1-3 & 5 categories will be governed by the Admission rules of the Mahatma Gandhi University.

V. STUDENT SUPPORT PROGRAMMES

1. NSS

National Service Scheme, popularly known as NSS is a student – centered programme and it is complementary to education. NSS is a government sponsored public service programme under the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports with primary focus on the development of personality of students through community service. It is a noble experiment in academic extension. It inculcates the spirit of voluntary work among students and teachers through sustained community interaction. It brings our academic institutions closer to the society. It is a link between the campus and community, the college and village, knowledge and action. The overall aim of NSS is the Personality Development of students through community service. It gives an extension dimension to Higher Education system and orients the student youth to community service. The Motto of NSS "Not Me But You", reflects the essence of democratic living and upholds the need for self-less service.

NSS unit of St. Aloysius College was initiated by the College from the very beginning of its origin under the university level. The unit of NSS working in the college have bagged the 'best unit', award many time in its glorious history.

In respect of NSS candidates the bonus marks will be awarded on the basis of NSS certificates signed by the Vice-Chancellor or the Pro-Vice Chancellor to volunteers who have completed 240 hours of work within a period of 2 years in the courses of study immediately preceding the course for which admission is sought.

2. NCC

(ARMY & NAVY)

National Cadet Corps has shaped the lives of millions of people of the country. It remains committed to producing vibrant disciplined citizens who are capable of taking our nation to great heights. The NCC aims at developing character, comradeship, discipline, secular outlook, the spirit of adventure and ideals of selfless service amongst young citizens. Further, it aims at creating a part of organized, trained and motivated youth with leadership qualities in all walks of life, who will serve the nation regardless of which career they choose. Needless to say, the NCC also provides an environment conducive to motivating young Indians to join armed forces. The NCC provides exposure to the cadets in a wide range of activities, with a distinct emphasis on Social Services, Discipline and Adventure Training.

Participation in various camps (ATC, CATC, TSC, NIC, AAC, RDC), 75% attendance in Institutional Training (3 yrs) and Certificate Examination (B&C) will fetch the cadets 15% grace marks in University examinations. Enrolment strength for Army NCC is 160 and Navy 50.

Bonus of 15 marks for the Degree course and 5 for the PG course shall be awarded to NCC candidates for admission to all courses. An additional bonus marks of 3 will be given to 'A' certificate holders, 5 marks to 'B' certificate holders, 5 marks to 'C' certificate holders in proof of their high proficiency.

NB: The benefit of bonus marks can be scored by a candidate only under one category i.e., either NSS or NCC.

3. ADDITIONAL SKILL ACQUISITION PROGRAMME (ASAP)

ASAP is a programme initiated by Government of Kerala to develop and enhance the skill sets of students in our colleges and schools by imparting career-oriented training to them. In our College the ASAP programme was started in the academic year 2013-2014. The first year degree students have the opportunity to join this programme. The

programme is designed as an add-on to the regular course without affecting their classes. As a part of the programme students are trained in Communicative English skills and basics of Information Technology in addition to the job oriented skill course which they choose.

4. WALK WITH A SCHOLAR PROGRAMME (WWS)

Walk With a Scholar programme (WWS) is a programme organized by the Govt. of Kerala for supporting/motivating students for achieving better life in future. Currently, two batches; 2014 - 17 and 2015 -18, each with 30 students are ongoing mentoring sessions. Both external and internal mentoring sessions are included in this programme. Each internal mentor is responsible for giving 15 hours of mentoring to his/her six mentees. Students also have external mentoring sessions of 15 hours duration.

5. SCHOLAR SUPPORT PROGRAMME (SSP)

The SSP Programme was started in the college during the year 2014-15. As per the instruction of the Academic council, the classes were arranged in the departments of English, Mathematics, Physics, Economics and Commerce. The classes were arranged for first year, second year and third year students. The classes can be conducted at Saturdays/ holidays/ special timetable on working days by considering the convenience of the participants and faculties. It was also decided that minimum 10 sessions need to be completed before November for I, III & V semesters and another 10 hours before the end of March for II,IV &VI semesters

Study materials were distributed and classes were conducted as per the instructions and proper documentation were maintained for the future reference. It was really helping hand for weaker students for the exam preparations. External Mentoring sessions were conducted during this academic year.

6. TUTORIAL SYSTEM

As per UGC norms, the college provides tutors for all the students. Each student is under the special attention of a class teacher who has frequent interaction with the students and their parents. The data about the student is recorded in a format. The students are also free to approach the Head of the Department and the Principal to discuss various matters pertaining to their studies and personal problems.

7. GUIDANCE AND COUNSELLING

As the youth needs more concern and sympathy and to lead them

to maturity, the college provides guidance and counselling. The service of an expert counsellor is made available on all working days. Teachers are also available for counselling on request.

8. MENTORING SYSTEM

In order to give more personal and continuous attention to each student, we follow the mentoring system. Each mentor is in charge of a group of around 20 students each. In addition to the class teacher, who takes care of the academic performance, the mentor has to look at the all round development of each student mainly through career functions and psychosocial functions.

9. VALUE EDUCATION

‘Character is destiny’. True to this dictum, the college enlightens the youth about the significance of values through value education classes held on the 7th and 18th working day of every month. Holy Mass for catholic students and life guidance class for all students are arranged on all first Fridays. The college has published a book, entitled ‘Fragrance of Values’ to be used as a text for engaging value education classes.

10. HAPPY HOME MAKING

It is a noble venture of the “Women’s Forum”. It aims at creating and developing the artistic skills of the lady students of the college. It gives them opportunities to learn painting, knitting, embroidery, clay modeling, carving, interior decoration, cooking, flower arrangements, gardening and Hospitality.

11. ALOYSIAN CREATIVE UNIT

The unit is established to develop the innate talents of the students by providing lessons in painting, flower making, bouquet making and banner writing.

1. LIBRARY

The Hostel is run by SABS sisters. Students staying in the hostel shall directly be under the disciplinary supervision of the Warden. Application for admission to hostels shall be made in the prescribed form available in the hostel. Students admitted to the hostel are expected to stay for the whole academic year and no refund of the caution deposit and the establishment fee for the term will be made to the student who leaves the hostel during the term. A resident who is vacating the hostel must give two weeks written notice to the warden.

1. The Hostel mess is run on dividing system and the mess fee for a month will be announced before 5th of every month.
2. The inmates are expected to take meals at the appointed hours and also to keep the dining hall clean.
3. Perfect silence is to be observed during the time of study and sleep.
4. No inmates shall abscond herself from the hostel without previous permission from the warden.
5. On re-opening days after Onam, Christmas and summer holidays, all the hostelers must be present.
6. No student shall miss any class without sufficient reason and previous permission from the warden.
7. At hostels only the visitors approved by parents will be allowed. Visiting time in the hostel is between 4.00 pm and 6.00 pm. Students shall not take their visitors to their room.
9. Hostelers are generally permitted to go home on second and fourth Saturdays.
10. Ragging, political agitation, strikes or demonstration of any kind are prohibited.
11. As per G.O.RT/No 346/05/Higher Edn. Dt. 1.3.2005 the use of mobile phone is strictly banned. Misconduct or serious break of any hostel rule will render the offender liable to suspension or dismissal according to the gravity of the offence.

3. STUDENT'S COUNSELLING CENTRE

The centre organises orientation programme for students and provides counseling facility for the needy. It aims at protecting the emotional security of our students. Mr. George Alex Oommen, Counselling Psychologist M.Sc, M.Phil, provides expert counselling on all working days. S. Lt. Paul Jacob & Mariamma C A are the co-ordinators of the counselling centre.

4. CO-OPERATIVE SOCIETY

The students and the staff are the members of the society. The objective of the society is to sell books, stationery and other educational accessories for the convenience and benefit of the members. The membership fee is Rs. 5 for students and Rs. 10 for staff. The society runs a store which makes available stationary, text books, note books etc., at concessional rates. All members are requested to make the purchases from the society.

5. INTERNET

The College has broad band internet facility spread over eight terminals connected by LAN. Students and members of the staff can have access to various web sites including the best libraries across the globe through the internet.

6. PHOTOSTAT, CD WRITER, SCANNER

Two photocopiers are installed in the college, one near Fr. Punnappadom Hall and the other in the College Library. Staff and students can have copies of their documents at reasonable rates. Scanner is also made available to the students.

7. MEDIA & SMART ROOM

It is a place where students meet and view classic movies, conduct discussions and practice film criticism. Students are given practical guidance in documentary making, videography, editing and dubbing. Media room is equipped with digital camera, digital handycam, LCD projector and OHP. The students of B.A. English have already produced a thirty minutes documentary on Kuttanad named "TARGET"

8. COLLEGE CANTEEN

There is a canteen in the college campus for the benefit of the students and staff.

9. SPORTS FACILITIES

1. Gymnasium

Keeping in view the fitness aspects of the whole community of the

college, a gymnasium is set up in the college premises under the physical education department. The multigym comprises of several modern equipments. Users may avail the facility of its different equipments under the guidance of well trained Physical Instructor.

2. Semi Olympics Swimming Pool

By utilizing the UGC fund (XII plan) and managements financial support, a semi-olympic swimming pool has been constructed in the college campus. UV water purifying system is used in this pool.

3. Cricket Practice Net

The PTA of the college sponsored two cricket bat practice nets and was inaugurated by Sreesanth former Indian Cricketer.

4. Basket Ball

Basket ball court and equipments are provided for the students to practice in the campus.

5. Football

The football ground in front of the college has official field sizes and dimensions. The college football team practice daily and bagged many prizes in various university and state board competitions.

6. Volley Ball

The students utilize the Volley Ball court and equipments provided by the college.

7. Indoor Games

The college provides spaces and equipments for table tennis, badminton etc.

10. HERITAGE MUSEUM

It is intended as a store house of information about the yester-years of Kuttanadu, a repository for exhibition and a resort for scholars. We intend to acquire as many materials, implements, vessels, tools and articles that were used in Kuttanad from time immemorial.

11. ELECTRONICS WORKSHOP

A workshop is opened for the students of the UGC sponsored B.Sc EEM course. The students undertake their experiments as well as repairing of electronic equipments in the workshop.

12. THEATRE

Aiming to provide entertainment to the student, the theatre offers screening of popular and art movies as well as documentaries. It also serves as a platform for budding cinematographers to view, discuss and review movie classics.

VIII. EXTENSION PROGRAMMES

1. ALOYSIAN STUDY CENTRE ON KUTTANAD (ASCK)

The Kuttanad Study Centre is established to pursue studies and research on various issues confronting Kuttanad. Besides collecting relevant documents and holding studies, it has collected reports of various committees on Kuttanad, conducted several surveys on various problems confronting Kuttanad and published several books on Kuttanad.

It has the following major objectives:

- [i] To pursue studies on issues confronting Kuttanad
- [ii] To make available the existing literature on Kuttanad
- [iii] To study the social, political, economical, cultural, agricultural, geographical and other changes that took place in Kuttanad in yesteryears for a better tomorrow.

The Centre (ASCK) irrespective of caste, creed, religion, economic status or political affiliation and profit motives works for the betterment of Kuttanad. Through discussions, debates, seminars, research studies, publications, consultancy, adoption of villages etc. the centre intends to discharge its objectives to maintain Kuttanad as the 'Paradise of Kerala'. The Centre stands for its vision and mission of independent research and collaboration with other agencies to protect Kuttanad from ecological destruction.

2. LANGUAGE LAB TRAINING

A Language Lab in the Department of English started with the financial aid of Kinder Mission Werk and the Carol Singers of St. Sebastian Loberich, Germany, promotes the apt pronunciation and proficiency in communicative skill among the students. Orientation courses are also conducted for teachers and students of neighbouring schools.

3. EUREKA 2 K (A SCIENCE EXPERIENCING PROGRAMME)

The programme is oriented to develop scientific attitude and innovative skills among the students of the nearby schools. It is a two way process in the sense that the students of the college also gain knowledge by preparing the projects.

4. ALEEP (ALOYSIAN EDUCATION EXTENSION PROGRAMME)

An expert and dedicated team from various faculties has launched an extension programme, named ALEEP. It aims to educate the students of nearby schools and local people against social evils and to equip them to face the challenges of life by talks, discussions, audio-visual displays, and life exposure programmes.

5. TAX CONSULTANCY SERVICES

The Department of Commerce provides income tax consultancy service to the staff and the public in the computation of tax and submitting the returns

6. SOIL AND WATER TESTING LABORATORY

Department of Chemistry undertakes soil and water testing for the benefit of the public.

7. ALOYSIAN INSTRUMENTATION CENTRE

The department of Physics, with the assistance of Department of Science and Technology, Delhi (through DST-FIST Program) has set up and instrumentation centre to provide the facilities of sophisticated analytical instruments to the researchers and students within and outside the college. The centre have the following sophisticated instruments.

IX. CLUBS AND FORUMS

1. ALUMNI

It provides opportunities to the alumni to meet together and come into contact with their Alma Mater. The association co-operates with the college authorities in various programmes for further developments. It serves as an agency for creating and maintaining good public opinion about the college. The annual get together of the Alumni Association is held on the second Saturday of January every year. The association conducts cultural competitions among the outgoing students every year and prizes are distributed to the winners. Every year the retiring members of the staff are honoured by the association. The alumni who rise to prominent positions in society are also honoured by the association. Alumni Association membership fee is collected from the students at the time of leaving the college with TC. Foreign chapters of the Aloysian Alumni Associations can be formed with written permission and approval of the executive committee of alumni Association.

The Association conducts Adv.V. Vinodkumar lecture and the inter-collegiate debate competition in memory of our beloved alumnus late Adv.V.Vinodkumar. Ever-rolling trophy and cash prizes are distributed.

2. POST GRADUATE STUDENTS FORUM:

All the Post Graduate Students of the college are members of the forum. It works as a common platform for the joint activities of the P.G. students of the college. Programmes like personality development and career guidance are organized under its banner.

3. SHAKESPEARE CLUB

The Department of English has embarked upon an ambitious programme, by constituting a Shakespeare Club, to make the lovers of English literature in our College enjoy Shakespeare's works. The Club enacts scenes from Shakespeare's plays.

4. ALOYSIAN NEIGHBOURHOOD FORUM (ANF)

An initiative in 2012 as an outreach programme in the neighbourhood society of the college.

5. AMATEUR ASTRONOMY CLUB

Club has a Newtonian and a Galilean telescope. The club periodically conducts sky watching for the public and the students of the neighboring schools.

6. NON-CONVENTIONAL ENERGY CLUB

The club has solar cooker, wind mill, solar still, solar panel and solar lamp. The working of these instruments is demonstrated and familiarized for the neighboring school students during the two day workshop "EUREKA".

7. METEOROLOGY CLUB

The club has the instruments: Solar Power Meters-Surya Mapi, Self Recording Rain Gauge, Barometer, Open Pan Evaporimeter, Cup Type Anemometer, Hygrometer, Wind Vane, Sunshine Recorder, and Bimetallic Thermograph.

X. COLLEGE RULES

1. M.G. UNIVERSITY CODE OF CONDUCT

MAHATMA GANDHI UNIVERSITY STUDENTS CODE OF CONDUCT RULES 2005

Maintenance of discipline in college campus Framing and implementation of rules approved - Orders issued

Election Section

No. 162/2004/2/Eln. Priyadarshini Hills, dated, 16th Feb. 2005

READ : (1) The Guidelines enunciated in para 7 of the affidavit filed by the Government in RP No. 435/2003

(2) Judgement of the Hon. High Court of Kerala in RP No. 437/2003

ORDER

As per paper (2) read above, the Hon. High Court of Kerala had directed the State Government and all the Universities in Kerala to lay down rules, for maintaining discipline in all the colleges including Government owned and affiliated, which will be binding on all the students in these institutions.

In exercise of the powers conferred under section 10(17) of the Mahatma Gandhi University Act 1985 the Vice Chancellor, subject to ratification by the Syndicate has approved the Mahatma Gandhi University Students Code of Conduct Rules 2005 (appended) to be implemented for maintaining discipline in the campus immediately.

Orders are issued accordingly

1. Title

These rules shall be known as Mahatma Gandhi University Students' Code of conduct Rules - 2005. It shall come into force with immediate effect.

2. Object

These rules are framed with a view to maintaining and enforcing good conduct inside the class rooms and campus in the affiliated colleges, Departments of teaching and Research and self financing schools of the Mahatma Gandhi University

3. Application

These rules shall be applicable to all the affiliated colleges under the University, University departments of teaching and research and self financing school of the University.

4. Definitions

- 1) College: Means a college as defined in Section 2(2) and Section 2(7) of the M.G. University Act 1985.
- 2) Vice Chancellor: means the Vice Chancellor of the Mahatma Gandhi University.
- 3) Students Grievance Redressal Committee:- Students Grievance

Redressal Committee constituted as per Rule 8 of these Rules.

- 4) Student: means a part time or full time student as defined in section 2(26) of Mahatma Gandhi University Act.
- 5) Principal- Means Head of College as defined in Section 2(16) of the Mahatma Gandhi University Act 1985.
- 6) Political activity: Political activity means any act, activity or conduct by any student in a college by which political ideologies of any political parties recognized by the Election Commission are preached, professed, imparted or disseminated by speeches, visible representation or other means of communication, whatsoever.
In case of definitions not mentioned above, the definitions in the University Act and Statutes shall prevail
5. Prohibition on Political Activity inside the campus
 - a) No student of a college shall get himself involved in any political activity by himself or abet the said activity to be carried on by fellow students inside the campus in any manner whatsoever and any such activity is hereby banned inside the campus.
 - b) Taking part in any political activity by organizing students or to cause gatherings inside the college campus for the purpose of doing any activities as defined in Rule 4 (6) shall constitute serious indiscipline. Every member of such a gathering shall be individually liable and responsible for the gross indiscipline in this regard and the Principal shall have the power to take disciplinary action against students who indulge in the aforesaid activities.
 - c) It shall constitute gross indiscipline to call for and appeal to strike based on policies and ideologies that may be preached by the political parties or their sister organizations or students wings. The participants in the strike as aforesaid shall be dealt with by the disciplinary authority and they shall be imposed appropriate punishment as provided in these rules.
 - d) No student of a college shall stage or indulge in any activity like Dharna, Gherao, obstructing entry to and from any class room, office, hall or other places inside the campus and such activities shall be treated as misconduct.
 - e) No student shall shout slogans inside the class rooms, office or any other place inside the campus and obstruct and interfere or to cause disturbance and nuisance to the ordinary functioning of the

- institution. These activities shall be treated as misconduct.
6. Procedure for imposition of punishment
 - a) The principal of the college shall be the disciplinary authority in respect of the students in the college.
 - b) If, it comes to the notice of the Principal that a student or a class of students have committed misconduct as referred to in Rule 5 above and that the Principal is satisfied that there is prima facie enough material in the allegation against the delinquent student, he shall immediately pass an order suspending student/students from the college.
 - c) If the Principal is satisfied that the delinquency alleged in the complaint requires further investigation/enquiry, he shall report the matter to the college council. After reporting the matter and after seeking the views of the Council referred to above the Principal shall appoint a competent teacher/teachers to enquire into the matter and to submit the report immediately.
 - d) The enquiry officer so appointed shall conduct enquiry without delay after gathering oral or written evidence from the complainant as well as the person against whom the allegations. delinquency, were made. The enquiry Officer also shall give fair and reasonable opportunity to all the parties and shall submit a report to the Principal without unnecessary delay. After the receipt of the report, the Principal shall consider the report and take appropriate action, which he deems fit. including the imposition of the following punishments.
 1. Imposition of fine
 2. Issuance of compulsory transfer certificate
 3. Dismissal from the college.In the event of imposition of punishment of dismissal or compulsory issuance of transfer certificate the principal shall forward the order along with the report to the University.
 7. Prohibition of damage to property The students shall not disfigure the class rooms, compound wall, or other buildings, inside the college campus by pasting posters or writing on the walls in connection with any activity. They shall not damage or destroy any furniture, equipments and other materials inside the college campus. In the event of any student indulging in any such activities,

a fine shall be imposed on him, to be fixed by the Principal of the College after evaluating the extent and magnitude of the damages so caused. The aforesaid imposition of the fine is without prejudice to the liability of the delinquent student for prosecution under the provisions of the Indian Penal Code or under the provisions of Prevention of Damage to Public Properties Act. The damage so fixed by the Principal shall be recovered as arrears of land revenue and in the event of nonpayment the recovery proceedings shall be taken against the person responsible

8. Student's Grievance Redressal Committee In every college there shall be a Students Grievance Redressal Committee constituted by the Principal. The Chairman of the said committee shall be the Principal. The committee shall consist of three teachers nominated by the College Council of whom one shall be a lady teacher. The Chairman of the College Union as well as the secretary shall be the ex-officio members of the said committee. The committee shall generally discuss the various basic problems of the students and any unhealthy relationship between the students, students and teachers or students and non-teaching staff of the college and suggest and implement remedial measures.

9. Right to Appeal

A student against whom the disciplinary orders had been passed, shall have a right to appeal to the Board for Adjudication of Students Grievance as provided in Chapter 27 of Mahatma Gandhi University Statute 1997. The appellate authority shall have the power to set aside, modify or cancel the order, provided the appeal is found to be genuine and filed within the period of 30 days from the date of receipt of the order. The appellate authority shall also have the power to condone the delay in filing the appeal if it is proved to the satisfaction of the appellate authority by the appellant that he was prevented by sufficient cause from preferring the appeal within the time.

2. GENERAL DISCIPLINE

- 1 All students are responsible to the Principal for their conduct both in and out of the college.
- 2 They shall respect all the teachers and greet them when they meet first either in the campus or outside.

- 3 When a teacher or a visitor enters the classroom the students should stand up and remain so until they are permitted to sit.
- 4 Students should not enter or leave classroom without permission. They shall not enter other classes without permission.
- 5 During free hours students are expected to make use of the library. No one should be found loitering on the veranda disturbing the other classes.
- 6 They shall not deface the college walls and furniture by writing, engraving, stamping, pasting etc. Everyone shall consider and handle the college property and library books as his/her own.
- 7 Students are forbidden to organize or attend any meeting in the campus without the prior permission of the Principal. They are not allowed to address the college authorities in a group; such action is subversive. Written sanction of the principal is necessary to collect any fund or to circulate notice or petition of any kind by any student either in the campus or outside.
- 8 It is mandatory for all the students to wear the ID Badges in the campus.
- 9 Any student who is persistently insubordinate, wilfully mischievous and who is likely to have an unwholesome influence on fellow students, may be removed from the rolls.
- 10 The educational concessions extended and the scholarships awarded are liable to be forfeited for any misconduct. Such concessions and scholarships may be withdrawn from students who resort to any misconduct.
- 11 The students are free to consult the Principal on any matter of college discipline, academic performance, co-curricular activities etc. On any matter of dispute, the decision of the Principal shall be final.
- 12 Smoking which is injurious to health is strictly prohibited inside the college campus.
- 13 Political activism and students strike is strictly banned inside the campus. Students are forbidden to organize or attend meetings other than the official ones.
- 14 Silence is expected during official programmes of the college.
- 15 The following instructions should be followed by the students with regard to study tours.

- a Only final year students are allowed to organize study tours.
- b Study tours should be conducted only with the prior permission of the Principal and the class teacher.
- c Booking of vehicles and arrangements for stay while on tour should be made only after consultation with the class teacher concerned.
- d Class Teachers or other teachers deputed by the respective Heads of departments should accompany the students.
- e Any act of indiscipline while on tour shall be considered as an act of indiscipline committed on the campus and will attract punitive action.
- f The use of alcohol, drugs and smoking is strictly prohibited while on tour.
- g Each and every member of the party should try to see that their conduct while on tour, upholds the prestige and reputation of the college.

3. RAGGING

റാഗിംഗ് എന്നാൽ ഏതെങ്കിലും വിദ്യാഭ്യാസ സ്ഥാപനത്തിലെ ഒരു വിദ്യാർത്ഥിയോട് ക്രമവിരുദ്ധമായ പെരുമാറ്റം മൂലം ആ വിദ്യാർത്ഥിക്ക് ശാരീരികമോ മാനസികമോ ആയ പീഡനം ഉണ്ടാകുന്നതോ ഉണ്ടാക്കാൻ സാധ്യതയുള്ളതോ അല്ലെങ്കിൽ ഭയാശങ്കയോ, ഭയപ്പാടോ, അപമാനമോ, ബുദ്ധിമുട്ടോ ഉണ്ടാകുന്നതോ ആയ ഏതെങ്കിലും പ്രവൃത്തി ചെയ്യൽ എന്നർത്ഥമാകുന്നതും, അതിൽ-

- (1) അങ്ങനെയുള്ള വിദ്യാർത്ഥിയെ ശല്യപ്പെടുത്തുന്നതോ, അധികേഷ പിടിക്കുന്നതോ, പരിഹസിക്കുന്നതോ, ഉപദ്രവിക്കുന്നതോ; അല്ലെങ്കിൽ
- (2) ഒരു വിദ്യാർത്ഥി സാധാരണഗതിയിൽ സ്വമനസ്സാലെ ചെയ്യാൻ ഒരു വെടാത്ത ഏതെങ്കിലും പ്രവൃത്തി ചെയ്യുന്നതിനോ, നിർവ്വഹിക്കുന്നതിനോ ആവശ്യപ്പെടുന്നതോ ഉൾപ്പെടുന്നതാകുന്നു.
- (3) റാഗിംഗ് നിരോധനം: ഏതൊരു വിദ്യാഭ്യാസ സ്ഥാപനത്തിന്റെയും അകത്തും പുറത്തും റാഗിംഗ് നിരോധിച്ചിരിക്കുന്നു.
- (4) റാഗിംഗിനുള്ള ശിക്ഷ: ഏതെങ്കിലും വിദ്യാഭ്യാസ സ്ഥാപനത്തിനകത്തോ പുറത്തോ റാഗിംഗ് നടത്തുകയോ, റാഗിംഗിൽ പങ്കെടുക്കുകയോ അതിന് പ്രേരിപ്പിക്കുകയോ അല്ലെങ്കിൽ റാഗിംഗ് പ്രചരിപ്പിക്കുകയോ ചെയ്യുന്ന ഏതൊരാളും കുറേ സ്ഥാപനത്തിന്മേൽ,

രണ്ടു വർഷം വരയാകാവുന്ന കാലയളവിലേക്ക് തടവുശിക്ഷ നൽകി ശിക്ഷിക്കപ്പെടേണ്ടതും അയാൾ പതിനായിരം രൂപ വരയാകാവുന്ന പിഴശിക്ഷയ്ക്കും കൂടി വിധേയനാകേണ്ടതുമാണ്.

(5) വിദ്യാർത്ഥിയെ പിരിച്ചുവിടൽ: 4-ാം വകുപ്പിൻ കീഴിലുള്ള ഒരു കുറ്റത്തിന് ശിക്ഷിക്കപ്പെടുന്ന ഏതൊരു വിദ്യാർത്ഥിയെയും വിദ്യാഭ്യാസസ്ഥാപനത്തിൽ നിന്നും പിരിച്ചുവിടേണ്ടതും അങ്ങനെയുള്ള വിദ്യാർത്ഥിക്ക് പിരിച്ചുവിടൽ ഉത്തരവ് പുറപ്പെടുവിച്ച തീയതി മുതൽ മൂന്നുവർഷക്കാലത്തേക്ക്, മറ്റു യാതൊരു വിദ്യാഭ്യാസ സ്ഥാപനത്തിലും പ്രവേശനം നൽകാൻ പാടില്ലാത്തതുമാകുന്നു.

(6) വിദ്യാർത്ഥിയെ സസ്പെൻഡ് ചെയ്യൽ: (1) മുൻ പറഞ്ഞ വ്യവസ്ഥകൾക്ക് ഭംഗം വരാതെ, ഒരു വിദ്യാഭ്യാസ സ്ഥാപനത്തിന്റെ മേധാവിയോട് റാഗിംഗിനെക്കുറിച്ച് ഏതെങ്കിലും വിദ്യാർത്ഥിയോ, അതതു സംഗതിപോലെ, മാതാപിതാക്കളോ, രക്ഷകർത്താക്കളോ അഥവാ ആ വിദ്യാഭ്യാസ സ്ഥാപനത്തിലെ ഏതെങ്കിലും അധ്യാപകനോ രേഖാമൂലം പരാതിപ്പെട്ടാൽ ആ വിദ്യാഭ്യാസ സ്ഥാപനത്തിന്റെ മേധാവി, പരാധി ലഭിച്ചു ഏഴു ദിവസത്തിനകം, പരാതിയിൽ പറഞ്ഞിരിക്കുന്ന സംഗതിയെ സംബന്ധിച്ച് അന്വേഷണം നടത്തേണ്ടതും, പ്രഥമദൃഷ്ട്യ സത്യമുണ്ടെന്ന് കണ്ടാൽ, കുറ്റാരോപണവിധേയനായ വിദ്യാർത്ഥിയെ സസ്പെൻഡ് ചെയ്യേണ്ടതും, ഉടൻതന്നെ, പ്രസ്തുത പരാതി ആ വിദ്യാഭ്യാസ സ്ഥാപനം സ്ഥിതി ചെയ്യുന്ന പ്രദേശത്ത് അധികാരിതയുള്ള പോലീസ് സ്റ്റേഷനിലേക്ക് മേൽ നടപടിക്കായി അയച്ചുകൊടുക്കേണ്ടതുമാണ്.

4. ETHICS AND ETIQUETTE

1. Timeliness: Students are required to reach the college in time.
2. Sincerity: Attend every class with genuine interest and wholehearted co-operation.
3. Cleanliness: Cleanliness is next to Godliness. Keep the campus clean. Don't throw any waste materials on the floor or ground but shall drop them in the dustbins kept for the purpose.
4. Discipline: After the second bell in the morning, every student must be in the class room. Standing on the 'Veranda' is not allowed. Observe silence during prayer. Keep silence in the library. Learn to give respect and take respect.
5. Dressing: Keep modesty in dressing.
Boys are not allowed to wear collarless shirts in the Campus. Students wearing 'dhoti' should not fold it inside the campus.
Girls are earnestly advised to avoid wearing Mini skirts, sleeveless and deep necklines, flimsy clothes, short tops and legins of transparent materials. They are also advised to wear a shawl /Dupata
6. Etiquette: Smoking is strictly prohibited in the campus. Use of intoxicants like drugs, liquor, pan masala etc. is strictly banned. Anybody violating this rule has to face serious consequences. Decent behaviour is expected in bus and boat. Any complaint of

misbehaviour will be seriously dealt with. Vulgar comments on the opposite sex will invite serious actions. Wandering inside the campus is prohibited.

7. General code of conduct: Use English for communication. Utilize library during lunch break and free hours. Actively participate in the extra-curricular activities like NSS, NCC, Clubs and Associations etc.

5. MOBILE PHONE

Government had banned the use of mobile phones in College campus Vide G.O. No. RT/No.346/05. Higher Education dated 1/3/2005. The College Council, the PTA General Body & the PTA Executive have discussed the matter seriously and decided to enforce it strictly for the good of the student community. The Ethics committee worked out the details of the enforcement and the following decisions were taken.

1. Students are not allowed to bring or use mobile phones in the campus, including classrooms and library.
2. If any student is found with mobile phone in hand or using it, it shall be reported to the department concerned.
3. All the teachers are authorised to report the same to the department concerned.
4. A fine of Rs. 100/- will be charged as penalty and the parents can claim the phone equipment from the Principal.
5. If repeated by the same student, the equipment will be withheld by the Principal. He/She can claim it along with caution deposit at the end of the course.
6. If parents want to contact their wards on urgency, if any, during college time, they can contact in the Phone No. 2212264 and 2215164 at the office.

6. TWO WHEELERS

Those students who resort to two wheelers for daily commuting should strictly observe all the safety rules issued by the motor vehicle department on and off the campus. They have to wear helmet and are not allowed to carry more than one person on the pillion. They should obtain parking permit from the college authorities to park their bikes in the parking shed. Two wheelers with parking stickers pasted near the headlamp unit will only be permitted to the campus. Near the gate the pillion should be emptied and the bike should be driven to the parking shed very slowly, carefully and

without making any unwanted noise. Bikes and parking permit are not transferable.

7. ATTENDANCE

- 1 Attendance will be marked at the beginning of each period. If the student is absent for one hour in a session it will be treated as absence for half-a-day.
- 2 Late-comers may be refused attendance for the period or marked late at the discretion of the teacher concerned. The college will not be responsible for any accident or untoward incident happening outside the campus during the class hours.
- 3 Attendance is a part of the internal assessment. Hence, students are cautioned to maintain full attendance.
4. If the student is absent, leave application should be submitted to the class teacher on the next day.
5. Students absenting themselves without leave for more than 10 working days will have their names removed from the rolls. They may be re-admitted at the discretion of the Principal after payment of re-admission fee and the first installment fees/semester fees.
6. Students shall make benefit from the services of mentors.
7. The student information system including attendance is automated.

8. LIBRARY

- a The College Library normally remains open from 9.00 am to 5. pm on all working days.
- b Members of the staff and students of the college are members of the library.
- c Students should submit their identity cards at the counter before entering the library.
- d Strict silence must be maintained in the library.
- e No books or periodicals shall be removed from the library unless it is registered at the issuing counter.
- f Borrowed books must be returned within a fortnight and they can be re-issued for a further period of 15 days, if no one else has applied for the book. A book may be recalled at any time even before the expiry of the period.
- g Members are expected to use books with care. If a book is lost or damaged, it should be replaced at once together with fine. If the book is not replaced, the defaulter shall pay two times the cost of the book together with fine. Students are not allowed to pass on

the books from one to another or to lend them to any one in or out of the college.

- h Books lost, damaged or defaced must be paid for by the student in whose name they were issued.
- i All books must be returned by due date. An overdue fine will be imposed on all books not returned on time; Rs 7 per week.
- j Students are liable to forfeit their membership of the library for disregard of the library rules, indiscipline or misbehavior.

9. STUDENTS PARLIAMENT & UNION EXECUTIVE

The Hon'ble High Court of Kerala, through its Judgement on 26-8-08 in the St. Aloysius College case, has permitted the college to conduct elections to the college union in the Parliamentary mode.

In the Parliamentary mode, the elected / nominated representatives from each class constitute the Parliament. The Union Executive consisting of the Chairman, Vice Chairman, General Secretary, Arts Club Secretary, Student Editor and two University Union Councillors are elected by the Parliament from among the members. The Principal shall be the ex-officio Patron of the Parliament and the Union Executive. The Moderator of the Parliament is the Dean of the student affairs. There will be two staff advisors to the Union Executive of which one shall act as the treasurer.

The Union Executive shall be accountable to the staff council and to the parliament. Important decisions should be ratified by these bodies.

All the students are members of the College Union.

2. E-Grants

The system is an integrated online software solution for the disbursement of the various educational assistance schemes of the Scheduled Castes Development Department. The beneficiaries of any educational assistance scheme have to first register by giving their basic details such as Name, Address, Date of Birth, Gender, Mobile Number, Bank Account details and Aadhar Number. Such registered students can apply through the same application for various schemes. Through a single registration, the system could uniquely identify a student and this basic detail shall be used for the disbursement of educational assistance throughout the period of education under various schemes. Provision for institutions will also be available for entering the applications, in case the student is not able to apply online. The financial assistance reaches the students bank account through Direct Beneficiary Transfer (DBT)

3. GOVERNMENT / UNIVERSITY SCHOLARSHIPS

National Loan Scholarship

Eligibility: 50% marks or above in the SSLC or Plus two examination in the first attempt. Income of parents/guardian from all sources should not exceed Rs.6000/- per annum. Students enjoying any other scholarships are not eligible. Application forms can be had from the office of the Director of Collegiate Education, Trivandrum-14, on payment of the required fee either in cash or by money order.

Mahatma Gandhi University Merit Scholarship

For the three year BA, B.Sc. courses: Eligibility: Must have passed Plus two examination in the first attempt with not less than 50% marks.

Govt. of India National Scholarship (Merit)

Eligibility: First class in the qualifying examination. Those who top the merit list within the quota allotted to the state will be eligible subject to certain conditions. Those who have passed the qualifying examination in the year prior to the year of award will not be eligible. Students enjoying any other scholarships or stipend will not be considered for the award but they can enjoy fee concession.

Merit Scholarship for the Children of School Teachers

Eligibility: Children of Primary and Secondary School teachers alone are eligible. Students enjoying any other scholarship will not be considered. Income of parent should not exceed Rs. 6000/- per annum.

Govt. of India Scholarship to the Physically Handicapped Students

Eligibility: Candidates should submit their applications in the prescribed form along with the required documents such as medical certificate, income certificate and certificates to prove age and educational qualification. Photograph is needed in the case of orthopedically handicapped applicants only.

Govt. of India Scholarships for Post Metric Students in Hindi from Non-Hindi Speaking States

Eligibility: Only those candidates whose mother-tongue is not Hindi are eligible. The candidates should study Hindi as one of the subjects. The number of scholarships may vary from year to year. Candidates who have passed the previous qualifying examination in the first or second attempt with not less than 70% marks alone are eligible. Application forms can be had from the Director of Collegiate Education, Trivandrum.

State Scholarship

Eligibility: 50% marks or above in the SSLC, Plus two or B.A, B.Sc. examination. Students who have passed the qualifying examination during the previous year can also apply. The awardee will not be allowed to receive any other scholarship. The annual income of parents/ guardians of the students of the Plus two and degree Course should not exceed Rs.2000/- and Rs.3000/- respectively. Scholarship amount for degree course is Rs.500/- per annum.

Educational Concession to the Forward and Backward Communities under Kumara Pillai Commission Report

Eligibility: The annual income of the family of the student should be within the limit of Rs.25,000/- and Rs.42,000/- for Degree and PG students respectively.

Educational Concessions for the Children and Grand Children of Political Sufferers

Children of freedom fighters whose annual income does not exceed Rs.3600/- are eligible. In case of INA personnel, the certificate issued by the All India I.N.Relief and Enquiry Committee, New Delhi, may be obtained and submitted with the application either in original

or copy attested by the District Collector or Revenue Divisional Officer instead of the certificate mentioned in Col. No.9 of the application form.

Educational Concessions for the Children of Service Personnel who have been Killed or Disabled in action on the Front

Eligibility: Children and dependents of service personnel who have been killed or disabled in action on the front and dependents of disabled and now employed service personnel if the annual income of such service personnel does not exceed Rs.3000/-. One service certificate from the Officer Commanding concerned, another certificate from the Tahsildar concerned to prove the relationship of the student to the service personnel and a dependency certificate should be produced along with the application. The awardees will not be allowed any other concession or scholarship. If he/she fails in any class or discontinues his/her course of study or changes the institution in which he/she studies, he/she will have to apply for the concession afresh. The income certificate in the application should be attested by a First Class Magistrate.

Harness Fee Concession

Eligibility: Children of Kerala Government servants who died in harness or died within six months after retirement. The deceased parent should have at least 5 years of service under the state Govt. Death certificate from the head of the office in which the deceased parent worked should also be produced. The annual income of the parent/guardian should be below Rs.3000/- excluding DA. The income certificate should be produced in the form of affidavit counter signed by a First Class Magistrate. Students enjoying any other fee concession or stipend or emoluments except National Loan Scholarship are not eligible.

Educational Concessions to Other Backward Communities

Under this scheme full fee concession shall be granted to students of Degree course and fee concession, Lumpsum grant and stipend for PG students by the Director of Harijan Welfare or District Welfare Office concerned. The income limit per annum for Degree Class is Rs.25,000/- and for PG Rs. 42,000/-. The concession will be withheld in case of and for misconduct, irregularity in attendance or unsatisfactory progress in studies. Students who had enjoyed fee concession in any previous course which was not necessary to secure the minimum qualification for admission to the new course are not eligible. If the father or mother of the student is a Government employee a salary certificate may be ob-

tained. Guardianship of others can be accepted only if the parents are no more. If the father is no more, a death certificate is to be produced. Applications are to be submitted within two months from the date of admission.
