Class Teachers were directed to identify the weak students from various classes of the first year UG batch to be mentored across one year by internal faculty members as part of the Student Support Programme (SSP), a Govt. of Kerala initiative. More than hundred scholarships are provided to students who excel in studies, cultural and sports activities. SAS Care foundation and Japan (Japanese Malayali Association) provides scholarship to meritorious students who have financial troubles. The final year UG students are given career Guidance programme. Orientation Programme for students, Parent teacher meetings, Awareness classes on different topics, Bank Test Coaching, Civil Service Coaching, and Net Coaching classes are conducted. Also students are encouraged to participate in various club activities. Talented students are encouraged to take part in competitions organised in other Colleges/ Institutions
