Profile

St. Aloysius College, Edathua is a first-grade college which has completed more than five decades of glorious service to the cause of higher education. Now, it is a well-established NAAC re-accredited (third phase) 'A' grade centre of learning offering a variety of undergraduate and post graduate programmes. The Department of Commerce and Physics offers facilities for research leading to the award of Ph D.

The college is situated in the Edathua Panchayat of the Kuttanad Taluk in the lake district of Alappuzha. It is the only temple of higher learning of the kind in the entire region of the one-time granary of Kerala, Kuttanad. Standing atop the main building of the college, there is a panoramic view of the paddy fields, clothed in the richest green. The luxuriant greenery, meandering rivulets and placid tranquillity altogether provide a congenial atmosphere for learning and development.

St. Aloysius College was founded in 1965 by St. George Forane Church, Edathua. It was the realization of the vision and far sightedness of late Very Rev. Fr. Zacharias Punnappadam (the first Manager) and Dr P.T. Joseph (the first Principal) under the patronage of Servant of God Mar Mathew Kavukattu. The great visionaries had in their mind the noble task of imparting quality higher education in the backward agrarian region of Kuttanad which lacked any facility for higher education. The college, though run by the catholic minority community, admits students of all castes and creeds with due respect to different faiths and religious denominations.

The College had a very humble beginning. It started functioning in St. Aloysius High School as a Junior college affiliated to the University of Kerala with 189 students, 9 teachers and 7 non-teaching staff. In 1966, the college was shifted to the present site. The institution owes an immense debt of gratitude to late Very Rev. Fr. Cyriac Kottayil who in his capacity as the manager was instrumental in erecting the main building of the college. In 1983, following the bifurcation of Kerala University, the college came under the jurisdiction of the newly established Mahatma Gandhi University.

To meet the ever-growing demand for higher education in the region, the college was upgraded in 1977 by introducing the undergraduate programme in Economics. Post graduate programme was introduced in 1984.

The College has now grown into a premier educational institution with 9 UG, 5 PG and 2 PhD programmes. It has now 73 teaching staff, 24 non-teaching staff and 1174 students on the rolls.

The top left segment of the emblem depicts the landscape of Kuttanad where the college is situated. St. Aloysius College is the only centre of higher education in Kuttanad.

The Book :

The open Book on the right segment stands for the book of knowledge from which generations of students have imbibed the wealth of knowledge to mould their lives as worthy citizens of the land. The beam of light that falls on the book signifies that true knowledge comes from God.

The Lighted Lamp :

The lighted lamp symbolizes the light of wisdom which dispels the darkness of ignorance and illiteracy and illuminates the students' mind with wisdom.

ACTIVITY REPORT

During August 2018 Kerala witnessed never before seen flood and Kuttanadu was one of the areas which was severely hit by this deluge. The academic year was also affected by missing many working days. However, the faculty and students worked hard to make up the missed classes by engaging special sessions. During and after the flood the College community rose to the occasion and organised several extension activities. Both wings of NCC and NSS organized several extension activities.

One major academic achievement for the institution in the year was the elevation of the PG department of Physics to the status of a research Centre through the order of Mahatma Gandhi University. Currently the department has 2 research guides.

Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) organized a one-day seminar on “Revised NAAC Accreditation Framework” on 29th September 2018. 2. Distribution of Financial Aid to Flood Affected Families- St. Aloysius College distributed financial aid and sanitation kits to the flood affected people in Kuttanad, with the financial support of Bahrain Awali Rifa Malayalae Association
3. Distribution of textbooks and notebooks to students who lost books in flood- Army and Naval NCC units of St. Aloysiuscollege with the support of Reaching Hands, an NGO based in Bangalore donated Rs. 1.5 lakh worth textbooks and notebooks to the flood affected students.
4. Re-build Kerala Survey in Edathua Panchayat- NCC Cadets and NSS volunteers carried out the re-build Kerala survey in Edathua panchayat. Rebuild Kerala was a State Government initiative aimed at rebuilding life in Kerala after the floods. 85 students participated in the survey. Students assessed the damage caused to buildings and updated the information in the GPS tagged Re-build Kerala mobile application.
5. SWACHH HI SEVA- NCC Army and Naval Units together organized Swachh Hi Seva cleaning programme on September 27. Cadets cleaned the college campus and surroundings which were badly hit by the deluge affected the region. Awareness rally was also conducted by the cadets. In addition to the cleaning drive cadets organized various programmes including essay writing competition, poster designing etc.
6. Cleaning Drive in Old Age Home- NCC cadets cleaned the premises of Anaprambal JMM Jubilee Old Age Home. The NCC Units sponsored the lunch for the inmates of the old age home. The cadets served and shared the lunch with the homeless and helpless inmates. Cadets also performed various cultural programmes.
