#### **Profile**

St. Aloysius College, Edathua is a first-grade college which has completed more than five decades of glorious service to the cause of higher education. Now, it is a well-established NAAC reaccredited (third phase) 'A' grade centre of learning offering a variety of undergraduate and post graduate programmes. The Department of Commerce and Physics offers facilities for research leading to the award of Ph D.

The college is situated in the Edathua Panchayat of the Kuttanad Talukin the lake district of Alappuzha. It is the only temple of higher learning of the kind in the entire region of the one-time granary of Kerala, Kuttanad. Standing atop the main building of the college, there is a panoramic view of the paddy fields, clothed in the richest green. The luxuriant greenery, meandering rivulets and placid tranquillity altogether provide a congenial atmosphere for learning and development.

St. Aloysius College was founded in 1965 by St. George Forane Church, Edathua. It was the realization of the vision and far sightedness of late Very. Rev. Fr. Zacharias Punnappadom (the first Manager) and Dr P.T. Joseph (the first Principal) under the patronage of Servant of God Mar Mathew Kavukattu. The great visionaries had in their mind the noble task of imparting quality higher education in the backward agrarian region of Kuttanad which lacked any facility for higher education. The college, though run by the catholic minority community, admits students of all castes and creeds with due respect to different faiths and religious denominations.

The College had a very humble beginning. It started functioning in St. Aloysius High School as a Junior college affiliated to the University of Kerala with 189 students, 9 teachers and 7 non-teaching staff. In 1966, the college was shifted to the present site. The institution owes an immense debt of gratitude to late Very Rev. Fr. Cyriac Kottayil who in his capacity as the manager was instrumental in erecting the main building of the college. In 1983, following the bifurcation of Kerala University, the college came under the jurisdiction of the newly established Mahatma Gandhi University.

To meet the ever-growing demand for higher education in the region, the college was upgraded in 1977 by introducing theundergraduate programme in Economics. Post graduate programme was introduced in 1984.

The College has now grown into a premier educational institution with 9 UG, 5 PG and 2 PhD programmes. It has now73 teaching staff, 22 non-teaching staff and 1150 students on the rolls.

## Valedictory of silver jubilee celebrations

The Silver Jubilee valedictory celebration of the department was held on 14 January, 2020. The programme was inaugurated by Dr. C.T Aravindakumar, Hon'ble Pro-Vice Chancellor of M.G University, Kottayam. He a renowned environmental scientist, is the Director of School of Environmental Sciences, the Honorary Director of Inter-University Instrumentation Centre, M.G University and visiting professor of California Institute of Technology, USA. His lecture was on 'Environment Impact Assessment'. Prof. Mathew Gregory, Vice-Principal, and Department HOD, introduced the chief guest and welcomed the gathering. Our Manager, Very Rev. Fr. Mathew Chooravady, delivered the presidential address and Principal Dr. Jochan Joseph gave an opportune message. The session also witnessed honouring our esteemed former teachers in the presence of a good gathering of our alumni. Our chief guest adorned the honourable teachers with 'Ponnada' amid a standing ovation. Prof. George P George, former HOD, felicitated and Thomaskutty Tom, Association Secretary, proposed the vote of thanks.

## **Cultivation of aptitude in basic science (CABS)**

A lecture series was initiated by the department with the support of IQAC of the college in connection with the silver jubilee celebrations of the department. It was decided to conduct the lecture every year in order to strengthen the foundations of the basic science among the graduate students and also among the students at the school level. The lectures also aim at introducing the students to renowned scholars working both at the national and international levels.

The maiden lecture of the CABS was conducted on 25 November 2019 in the college seminar hall. The invited resource person was Mr. Vidyanand Vijayakumar, formerly Research Associate, Julich Research Centre, Germany- one of the largest interdisciplinary research centres in Europewhere he worked on lithium-ion batteries. At present, he is, Senior Research Fellow, National Chemical Laboratory, Pune, Maharashtra. Vidyanand Vijayakumar spoke on 'Lithium ion batteries-history and future perspectives', one of the hot topics of the 21<sup>st</sup> century science which received recent attention by winning the Nobel Prize in Chemistry in 2020. Dr. Jochan Joseph, the Principal gave the keynote address and Dr. Anu Augustine, Association President, presided

over the function. The lecture was comprehensive and informative. An interaction session was also held after the lecture which was highly fruitful to the students.

#### **Extension activities**

During 2019-20, 10 soil samples collected from the paddy fields and orchard fields in various parts of Kuttanad were analysed for pH, organic carbon, nitrogen, phosphrous and potassium. Besides, 8 water samples from nearby villages were also analysed for pH, alkalinity, turbidity, hardness, chloride, iron and phosphate. Results were delivered with proper recommendations for advanced testing and follow up.

During the COVID 19 Pandemic period, the chemistry laboratory was busy with the preparation of hand sanitizer to be supplied to nearby localities around Edathua - A noble gesture of our social commitment. As per the instructions from the principal, the department initially made available hand sanitizer for the students and staff even before the declaration of lock down. It was provided to all students who came to college to attend the university examinations held in the first half of March, 2020.

The course is mainly intended for the final year undergraduate students of chemistry. The duration of the course is 30 hours, comprising 10 hours of theory, 15 hours of practical and 5 hours of group project.

Perhaps most importantly, debaters become self-directed learners, allowing them to take control of their education experience and continue to learn throughout their lives. This makes competitive debate a particularly affective vehicle for gifted and talented education. Debate requires students to engage serious subject matter in a mature and professional environment. Debate students show more maturity in the face of adversity and tend to develop stronger relationships with peers and mentors than the average student. Debate teaches students to recognize how others think, which improves their ability to cooperate and resolve conflicts. This makes debate one of the most successful vehicles for providing affective education to at-risk students. Ultimately, debate increases students' self-confidence by helping to teach them the skills necessary to become competent adults. All of these skills ultimately lead debate students to notable academic achievement.

After the evaluation, a team constituting 20 members were elected, representing the 2<sup>nd</sup> DC students of the different departments of our college.

The team has showcased their organizing caliber in all the main events hosted by the college including Arts day, college union inauguration, PTA General body meeting and retirement function.

The auspicious event of 'Exemplar Competition' is organized under the leadership of Sky Up team. The competition consisted of 5 rounds: (1) An evaluation by the class teacher based on ten criterias (2) Written test (3) Group Discussion (4) Personal interview and (5) Stage performanace

Aloysian Exemplar Contest is a journey to explore luminaries among Aloysians. The outgoing students of Degree and Post Graduate courses are evaluated on their academic performance and attendance and are then provided with an entry to the contest. The expedition to the title of Aloysian Exemplar begins with an evaluation made by respective class teachers based on 10 different criteria's, followed by a written test to assess the ability of the candidate in current affairs, English, numerical ability and logical thinking. It is worthy to make note that around 90 candidates appeared for the Written test. The third round was the Group Discussion. This was to assess the candidate's communication skill, leadership skill and team work. The shortlisted 34 were in to this round and the selected 16 were in to the next stage of personal interview round. Here a candidate is assessed on the basis of their confidence and personality. The final round is the stage performance, where the candidate presents themselves on behalf of the entire college community. Here the candidate showcases their talents. It is followed with a stress interview round. The final stage consisted of 10 finalists and the final Five students were qualified as Aloysian Exemplars for the academic year 2019-2020 based on the aggregate marks scored in each round.

The Exemplars are: 1)Jasmine Mathew M.Sc Physics 2) Mariya Varghese B.Sc Mathematics 3) Beatrice Betsy Babu M.Com Finance 4) Alphamol Sebastian M.Sc Physics and 5)Vishnu S. Kumar M.Com Finance.
